Prismatics (2024)

Duration: 6 minutes, 30 seconds

Prismatics is a spatial work that uses literal and approximate pitches of the harmonic series. Each of the five sections is based around one fundamental and the subsequent overtones of that fundamental. Each section is also based on a different intervallic realization of the harmonic series, including normal, inverted, wedge-shaped, double-wedge-shaped and a combination of the normal harmonic series and inverted harmonic series on the same fundamental. The expression of the piece comes from the wide range of tone colors and sound qualities of the wide array of instrumental and mute combinations that the brass quintet offers.
