

- Approximately 400 students in 16 undergraduate and graduate programs
- We hold about 300
 performances each year,
 including large ensembles,
 chamber music, operas, faculty
 performances, and student
 recitals.
- There are over 200 professional music and theatre companies within a seven mile radius of our school


CURRICULUM AND ACADEMIC POLICIES

UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAMS

- Bachelor of Science (1/2 music, 1/2 non-music)
 - Sound Recording Technology
 Performance and Non-Performance tracks
 - Performing Arts Management
 Non-Performance track
- Bachelor of Arts (1/3 music, 2/3 non-music)
 - Bachelor of Arts in Music
- Bachelor of Music (2/3 music, 1/3 non-music)
 - Jazz Studies
 - Music Composition
 - Music Education
 - Music Performance
 - Performing Arts Management



Undergraduate Degree Requirements



- All DePaul University undergraduate degree programs require a minimum of 192 credits.
- At minimum, the last 60 credits of a student's degree must be completed at DePaul.

QUARTER SYSTEM

- DePaul is on the Quarter system.
 - Each quarter is 10 weeks
 - Autumn, Winter, Spring
- Additional Terms (courses outside the School of Music)
 - Three Summer sessions
 - December Intersession



HOW MANY COURSES WILL I TAKE?

- A full-time course load is 12-18 credits per quarter
 - Full-time status is required for many things, including some forms of financial aid.
 - Additional tuition is charged for each credit hour above 18.
- International Students MUST maintain full-time status each quarter to be in compliance with student visa requirements.

LIBERAL STUDIES PROGRAM

- First-Year Program
 - Discover Chicago
 - Composition and Rhetoric I and II
 - Math and Technological Literacy
- Seminar on Multiculturalism in the US
- Experiential Learning and Senior Capstone (BA students only)
- Learning Domains
 - Arts and Literature
 - Scientific Inquiry
 - Philosophical Inquiry
 - Religious Dimensions
 - Social, Cultural, and Behavioral Inquiry
 - Historical Inquiry



MUSICIANSHIP CORE


Undergraduate students take a 2year sequence of musicianship courses:

- Music Theory I-VI
 - 2 credits each quarter (1st and 2nd year)
- Music History I-V
 - 2 credits each quarter (2nd year)
 - 2 credits in fall (3rd year)
- Aural Training I-VI
 - 1 credit each quarter
- Group Piano I-VI
 - 1 credit each quarter



MUSICIANSHIP CORE

- Students must pass each level with a C- or higher before proceeding to the next level.
 - Music education students must pass with a C or higher.
- Students who fail a level must wait a year before re-enrolling in that level.



UPPER LEVEL MUSICIANSHIP COURSES

After the two-year musicianship sequence is completed, students take the following:



- Advanced Musicianship
- Introduction to Jazz History
- Introduction to World Music
- Basic Conducting

PLACEMENT EXAMINATIONS



- Transfer students contact Dr.
 Jones to take exams for Theory
 and/or Music History
- It is possible to test out of Aural Training and Group Piano.
- Students who pass out of classes will need to replace the credit(s) with music electives (which can come from transfer credits) – in other words, you pass out of the class, <u>but not</u> <u>the credit</u>.

APPLIED LESSONS

- Requirements vary by degree program
- Limit of 3 credits per quarter (9 one-hour lessons per quarter)
- Limit of 36 credits in undergraduate career
- Lessons on non-audition instruments available through the Community Music Division




ENSEMBLES

- Large ensembles:
 - Chamber Choir
 - Concert Choir
 - Concert Orchestra
 - Symphony Orchestra
 - Wind Ensemble
 - Wind Symphony
 - 20+ ensemble
 - Jazz Ensemble
 - Jazz Orchestra
 - Jazz Vocal Ensemble
 - Jazz Workshop
- Small ensembles:
 - Chamber music
 - Jazz combos
- World Music Ensembles:
 - African Ensemble



ENSEMBLES (CONTINUED)



- Requirements vary by major and instrument - check your curriculum requirements!
- In most degrees, students enroll in 1 ensemble for 1 credit each quarter.
- Students with performance awards may be required to participate in ensembles different than or beyond their major requirements.
- After you are assigned to an ensemble, you must enroll yourself in Campus Connect, every quarter.

- Placement is assigned by ensemble directors and may include performing in more than one ensemble.

ELECTIVES

Music Electives

- Vary by major
- Any course in music counts towards music electives.

Free Electives



- Free elective means a student may select any course in the university.
- Free electives may be taken pass/fail.



ACADEMIC STANDING - HONORS

- Students who earn a term GPA of 3.5 or higher are placed on the Dean's List.
- Students graduating with a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher will receive the following graduation honors:
 - 3.5-3.69: Cum Laude
 - 3.7-3.84: Magna Cum Laude
 - 3.85-4.0: Summa Cum Laude



ACADEMIC STANDING — PROBATION AND DISMISSAL

- The School of Music requires that students maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 and make "meaningful progress towards the degree."
- Students who do not meet these criteria can be placed on SOM academic probation and are eligible for dismissal.



FAQs

REGISTRATION



- Registration typically opens during the sixth week of the term – check Campus Connect for your registration time.
- All incoming transfer students must meet with Amy prior to registering for the Winter Quarter.
- Music students are among the first to register, so take advantage of this!
- Check your registration!

COURSE WITHDRAWAL

- Important Deadlines (Check the DePaul calendar for exact dates):
 - Before 2 weeks no penalty on grade
 - After 2nd week W grade
 - After 7th week FX grade
- In case of medical or personal emergency, students may request withdrawal after the deadlines by submitting a request and supporting documentation to the Dean of Students Office.

MAJORS AND MINORS

- Can I double major? Yes, please discuss this with your advisor.
- What about minors outside of Music?
 Yes, many are possible.



SUMMER CLASSES OUTSIDE DEPAUL

- May I enroll in summer school courses at other institutions?
 - Yes, provided the University residency requirement is met
- What courses may I take elsewhere?



- Summer courses at other institutions must be reviewed and approved by the Assistant Director of Advising.
- Schedule a meeting with your advisor and obtain approval prior to enrolling in summer courses outside DePaul.

STUDY ABROAD



- Are music students allowed to participate in Study Abroad programs?
 - All programs/courses must be approved by the Associate Dean.
 - Students can most easily study abroad during the December Term, Spring Break, and/or the Summer Sessions.

- Amy Weatherford advises all first year students.
- Upper-level students are also assigned a faculty advisor.
- Schedule appointments each quarter through BlueStar

- Monitor your Degree Progress Report


DEGREE PROGRESS REPORT (DPR)
