School of Music Overview




Welcome to the School of Music

Undergraduate Degree Programs

- Bachelor of Science (1/2 music, 1/2 non-music)
 - Sound Recording Technology
 Performance and Audio Technology Tracks
 - Performing Arts Management Non-performance track
- Bachelor of Arts (1/3 music, 2/3 non-music)
 - Bachelor of Arts in Music
- Bachelor of Music (2/3 music, 1/3 non-music)
 - Jazz Studies
 - Composition
 - Music Education
 - Music Performance
 - Performing Arts Management





Undergraduate Degree Requirements

- All DePaul University undergraduate degree programs require a minimum of 192 credits
- The university residency requirement stipulates that a student's last 60 credits must be completed at DePaul





Quarter System

- DePaul is on the Quarter System
 - Each quarter is 10 weeks
 - Autumn, Winter, and Spring
- Additional terms (courses outside the School of Music)
 - Three summer sessions
 - December intersession



How Many Courses Will I Take?

- A full-time credit load is 12-18 credits per quarter
- Additional tuition is charged for each credit above 18
- Full-time status is required for many things, including some forms of financial aid and the UPass (CTA L/bus pass)
- International students who have a F-1 or J-1 visa must maintain fulltime status each quarter to be in compliance with student visa requirements

Music Core Curriculum: Theory, Aural Training, Group Piano

Undergraduate students take a two-year sequence of courses:

- Classical Performance and Musical Studies Students*:
 - Music Theory I-IV, Advanced Theory I and II (2 credits each quarter)
 - Aural Training I-VI (1 credit each quarter)
 - Group Piano I-VI (1 credit each quarter)
- Jazz Studies Students:
 - Music Theory I-III, Essentials of Jazz I-III (2 credits each quarter)
 - Aural Training I-III, Jazz Ear Training I-III (1 credit each quarter)
 - Group Piano I-III, Jazz Group Piano I-III (1 credit each quarter)

Music Core Curriculum: Musicology and Conducting

Students typically begin musicology courses in the second year.

- Select three of the following:
 - Music, History, and Culture I (4 credits)
 - Music, History, and Culture II (4 credits)
 - Global Music Cultures (4 credits)
 - Intro to Ethnomusicology (4 credits)
- Musicology Seminar (2 credits)

Students typically take conducting in their third or fourth year.

Basic Conducting (4 credits)




Music Core Curriculum: Passing Standard

Students must pass each level with a C- or higher before proceeding to the next level



Music Core Curriculum: Placement Examinations

- All first-year students are placed into sections of Music Theory and Group Piano
- It is possible to test out of some or all the Aural Training and Group Piano requirements
- Students who pass out of group piano or aural training will need to replace the credit(s) with music electives before graduation - in other words, you pass out of the class, but not the credit.



Applied Lessons

- Applied lesson requirements vary by program
- Limit of 3 credits of lessons per quarter
- Limit of 36 credits of lessons in undergraduate career
- Lesson on non-audition instruments available through the Community Music Division (not included in tuition/credits)


Ensembles (continued)

- Requirements vary by program and instrument
 check your curriculum requirements!
- In most degrees, students enroll in 1 large ensemble for 1 credit each quarter
- Students with performance awards may be required to participate in ensembles different than or beyond their degree requirements
- After you are assigned to ensemble(s), you must enroll yourself in Campus Connect, every quarter.



Electives

- The number of music electives and free electives vary by major
- A limited number of free electives may be taken pass/fail
- A list of music electives will be sent out each quarter



Academic Standing - Honors

- Students who earn a term GPA of 3.5 or higher are on the Dean's List
- Students graduating with a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher will receive the following graduation honors:
 - 3.5-3.69: Cum Laude
 - 3.703.84: Magna Cum Laude
 - 3.85-4.0: Summa Cum Laude





Academic Standing - Probation and Dismissal

 The School of Music requires that students maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 and make "meaningful progress towards their degree."


 Students who do not meet these criteria can be placed on SOM academic probation and are eligible for dismissal



FAQs

Registration

- Registration typically opens during the sixth week of the term
- All first-year students must meet with Amy each quarter prior to registration
- Music students are among the first to register, so take advantage of this!
- Check your registration!




Course Withdrawal

- Deadlines
 - Before two weeks, no penalty grade, course not counted towards term credit load
 - After 2nd week, W grade
 - After 7th week, FX grade
- In case of a medical or personal emergency, students may request an administrative withdrawal through the University Dean of Students Office after the deadlines with proper documentation.



Majors and Minors

- Can I double major?
 - Yes! Please discuss this with your advisor.
 - Double majors almost always necessitate additional time.
- What about minors outside of music?
 - Many are available
 - How easily a minor can be accommodated depends on many things, so discuss this with your advisor



Summer Classes Outside DePaul

- May I enroll in summer school courses at other institutions?
 - Yes, provided the university residency requirement is met
- What courses may I take elsewhere?
 - Courses taken elsewhere should be reviewed and approved by the Associate Director of Advising *prior* to enrollment.

- Schedule appointments through BlueStar
 - First year students must meet with Amy each quarter
- Things to discuss with your advisor:
 - Course planning, major/minor exploration, academic challenges, academic strategies, goal setting, learning styles, campus resources, and more.
- Use advising resources early and often






Degree Progress Report (DPR)

- Your Degree Progress Report in Campus Connect tracks and helps you plan your path to degree completion. It includes:
 - Requirement information for your declared majors (as well as double majors and/or minors)
 - What you have completed
 - Options for outstanding requirements
 - A "what-if" feature that allows you to see what your requirements would be if you were to change/add a major or minor

BlueStar

- BlueStar is an online system that supports your academic success. Through BlueStar, you can:
 - Connect with your advisor(s) and instructors
 - View campus resources
 - Receive notifications from faculty on your progress
 - Schedule advising appointments

D₂L

- D2L is DePaul's online course system. Many music classes will use D2L for sharing class resources, collecting assignments, and providing feedback
- At the start of each quarter, take some time to familiarize yourself with how each course is set up
- Courses in D2L do not appear until the instructor opens the course
